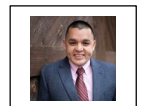
Monday, December 13th FVC Meeting

Technical Security Countermeasures



The Fox Valley Chapter had the privilege of having Marty Vander Vliet of Northport Security present on Technical Security Countermeasures. Mr. Vander Vliet discussed the fact that corporations can have the best physical security and trained security personnel to protect themselves from outside threats but are they protected from internal threats? The loss of intellectual property and confidential information not only affects corporations' bottom lines but has the potential to put them out of business entirely. Cameras and microphones and other recording devices have become so small, sophisticated and affordable, they can – and have – been found just about everywhere. Corporations have found devices in the C-Suite (including the area around administrative assistants), Human Resources, labs, Legal Departments, breakrooms and phone closets. The types of technical counter surveillance tools used by professionals to search for recording devices such as these include:
